


GIBBONS CROSSWORD WHAT TYPES OF ANIMALS ARE THESE? GIBBONS ARE ONE OF THE MOST THREATENED 1. "Spirits of the Night" is another name for this animal. PRIMATES ON EARTH. 2. This mammal is the largest species of primate. 3. It's name derives from the Greek language and means **GIBBONS ARE VERY STRONG** "Nose Horn" AND CAN SWING FROM BRANCH 4. A big cat that can see six times better than humans. **TO BRANCH, ALSO KNOWN AS** 5. It's roar can be heard up to 5 miles away. "BRACHIATING", AT SPEEDS OF **UP TO 35 MILES PER HOUR. THEY CAN ALSO BRIDGE GAPS OF UP TO 15.25 METRES.**

WESTERN LOWLAND GORILLA

Gorillas are the largest species of primate. Between Howletts and Port Lympne we have the largest collection of gorillas in the world!

GORILLAS SHARE 90% OF THEIR DNA WITH HUMAN BEINGS.

OUR GORILLAS ARE FED 6 TIMES A DAY. IN THE WILD THEY WOULD SPEND OVER HALF THE DAY FORAGING FOR FOOD. I can almost see everything that you can! I also have colour vision so that I can tell whether fruit is ripe enough to eat! mmmmmmmm!!!!!!

HOW WELL CAN I SEE? WHAT CAN I SMELL? **HOW MUCH DO I EAT?**

My nose is very sensitive and I can smell everything that you can and a little more! I can detect odors from different animals from quite far away. This helps me identify a potential mating partner or other male gorillas, especially silverbacks! They are really stinky because they emit a strong odour from their armpits to let other gorillas know where they are.

I eat around 18.15kg a day of vegetation in the wild. That's the equivalent of about 30 adult vegetarian meals! I pretty much eat all day in order to keep my energy up! My muscles are very big and need a lot of energy to keep them moving. I'll eat anything from shrubs to fruits, and even insects and termites!

My skin is a lot thicker than yours to provide some protection on my travels, from shrubs and stinging nettles. But like you I do still get stung by wasps.

I walk on all fours so my hands and feet are built to make sure I don't get hurt if I stand on anything sharp, but when I stand on a big thorn it really hurts, ouch!!!





HOW DO I CLEAN MYSELF?

When I was an infant my mother used to groom me, now that I am an adult I use my hands for grooming. We don't have regular baths so making sure that we are free from dirt and parasites is really important.



BIG CATS



Each tiger has unique stripes, just like our fingerprint. No tiger's stripes are exactly the same as another.

Tigers and lions can eat around 30-40kgs of food in one sitting.


Lions can run short distances at 30 miles per hour and can jump approximately 10 metres in length. How far can you jump?

BLACK RHINOS

Rhinoceros derives from the Greek language and means "nose horn". There are five species of rhino alive today; two from Africa and three from Asia.

Black rhinos are classed as critically endangered, that is why it is so important to us to look after them.



We hope that you have enjoyed exploring Port Lympne!


Both Port Lympne and our sister park, Howletts were set up to protect and breed rare and endangered animals, and where possible, return them to safe areas in the wild.
